Strong leadership is a hallmark of AFP Chicago. We seek highly-motivated and committed members for service on AFP Chicago's Board of Directors. The AFP Chicago Committee on Directorship invites the development community to submit nominations for the Board of Directors for service beginning on January 1, 2019.

Who are we looking for?

AFP Chicago seeks directors who are committed to the non-profit sector and to advancing philanthropy in the organizations and communities they represent. Directors are committed to ethical practice, donor rights, and other tenets of AFP International. AFP Chicago is strongly committed to embracing the diversity that makes up our greater Chicagoland community. We seek nominees who:

- Have been active AFP members (Chicago or other chapters) during each of the past two years;
- Have strong leadership and service orientation, interests and experiences;
- Serve a cross-section of Chicago's diverse communities; and
- Represent diversity of professional focus, age, race/ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation and geography.

What are the responsibilities for serving on the Board of Directors?

Board members represent the development profession in the greater Chicagoland philanthropy community. They are elected to one-year terms and may serve a maximum of eight consecutive terms. In addition, members of the board commit to:

- Provide strategic direction and leadership for the chapter;
- Support the chapter's revenue generation activities;
- Participate in six board meetings (meetings held during business hours in downtown Chicago); and
- Attend chapter education and membership programs throughout the year.

The deadline for submitting 2019 nominations materials is August 22, 2018. AFP Chicago's Committee on Directorship will review all nominations, and the chapter will present a final slate for election by AFP members in December 2018. In addition:

- Before nominating someone other than yourself, we ask that you seek that person's agreement to be nominated, and ask her/him to provide service and leadership information to support the nomination.
- Current Directors who wish to be considered for re-election to an additional one-year term must nominate themselves by submitting a completed application form.

AFP Chicago Board Membership Responsibilities and Eligibility Criteria

Members of the board of directors develop the policies for the Chicago chapter and monitor the execution of those policies. The board determines its present and future direction including long-range planning, fundraising, governance, financial management and personnel policy. In addition, AFP Chicago expects of all board members the following:

- To maintain active AFP membership, and demonstrate membership during each of the past (2) years (Chicago or other chapters);
- To promote the mission, vision and key messages of the Chapter;
- To ensure financial solvency and adhere to fiduciary responsibilities related to annual chapter activities;
- To attend all required board meetings;
- To serve as a chair of one board committee or participate on a committee or special project, as assigned by the President, President Elect, Immediate Past President or Chair of Directorship;
- To complete and submit on a timely basis all reports appropriate to board position;
- To sign the Conflict of Interest Statement and uphold its beliefs and values;
- To participate in the annual evaluation of the board of directors and ongoing board development process, including nominations of board leadership and committee chairs as appropriate;
- To lead/participate in annual planning, budgeting and leadership orientation activities;
- To support the efforts of the officers and chairs by actions such as 1) reviewing committee recommendations and materials presented to the board; 2) encouraging fundraising professionals to join AFP; and 3) encouraging member and nonmember participation in chapter programs;
- o To ensure that all activities are in adherence with the Chapter's bylaws, policies and procedures;
- To annually support the AFP Foundation for Philanthropy with a gift;
- To support AFP Chicago's efforts to embrace and engage diverse individuals, groups and organizations within the fundraising profession;
- To serve as an ambassador of AFP Chicago, and to the extent possible, AFP broadly; and
- To promote understanding of the significance of philanthropy.

Directors and officers of the Chapter shall exhibit the highest ethical and professional standards of the fundraising profession in their employment and participation in the chapter. AFP Chicago recognizes the CFRE credential and similar professional certifications as such standards. The chapter encourages chapter officers and directors to hold such credentials as they hold office.

AFP Chicago believes that the most diverse board of directors is the strongest board of directors. The Chicago chapter recruits board members that reflect the broader Chicago community and the depth of viewpoints that it has to offer.
