Phillippa has partnered with clients to advance their missions through campaign planning and feasibility studies, development assessments, data analytics, and more. She recently worked with The Apostolic Church of God to test a campaign for \$30 million, The Kessler School to test a campaign for \$7.5 million, and Chicago Youth Centers (CYC) on a Campaign Planning Feasibility Study to test a campaign for \$7.5 million. Prior to CYC, Phillippa's love for helping people brought her to HandsOn Broward, a non-profit organization that inspires, equips and mobilizes people to effect positive change in Broward County. She oversaw programming for 5,000+ volunteer recruitment and civic engagement projects that directly impacted 92,366 people. Her development assessments focused on widening capacity for foundation and corporate funding, increasing grant solicitations and corporate partnerships. Her largest grant received was a yearly allocation of \$85,226 from The Children's Service Council of Broward to HandsOn Broward to bolster their Literacy Volunteer Recruitment and Management. Her fervor for a data-driven solution to social issues grew and she sought to hone on her use of data analysis to increase the impact of philanthropies, foundations and non-profit organizations that serve people in need or address social issues.

Phillippa has two hometowns: St Mary, Jamaica and North Lauderdale, Florida. She currently lives in Chicago, Illinois and enjoys cooking traditional Jamaican dishes and exploring new cuisines. She loves to volunteer her time at local nonprofits and is a strong advocate for the upliftment of historically marginalized communities.
