2015 Chicago Fellows Program Program Description and Call for Applicants

Purpose

AFP Chicago's objective is to offer our educational resources and the collective professional expertise of our membership – in accessible and user-friendly formats – to assist individuals in building communities through philanthropy as well as building professional fundraising skills.

The **Fellows Program** is an outreach initiative of the AFP Chicago Chapter created to build awareness of these resources, particularly to those individuals who have been in the profession for three years or less and might otherwise not have the opportunity or resources to take advantage of its services.

This program is offered to any individuals working with or for nonprofit organizations in metropolitan Chicago, with an emphatic interest in people of color and/or Gay/Lesbian/Bisexual/Transgender/Questioning (GLBTQ). Individuals from grassroots organizations are strongly encouraged to apply.

Benefits and Expectations of Participation

Regular attendance is expected in this one-year program that will provide the following benefits to the selected Fellows:

- Complimentary 2015 AFP International and AFP Chicago Chapter memberships;
- Complimentary registration to AFP Chicago educational luncheon programs on a variety of philanthropic topics;
- Complimentary registration fee to the Midwest Conference on Philanthropy, held in Chicago; and
- Senior development professional assigned as a mentor upon graduation from the program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Be responsible for fundraising in a metropolitan Chicago area 501 (c)(3) organization;
- Have the full support of their supervisor and their organization's leadership to participate in this educational program;
- Be committed to attending the programs and events comprising the Fellows curriculum;
- Either not currently be a member of AFP or currently be a member for not more than two years, and continue paid membership in AFP for at least one year after the conclusion of the Fellows Program;
- Note that AFP Chicago will select the best candidates with the most need for Fellows Program resources;
- Preferred but not required – Identify themselves as an ethnic minority/GLBTQ/Disabled and/or work for an organization that represents that community.

Application Deadline and Review Process

To apply, candidates should submit the completed application form by **Monday, October 20, 2014**.

Please note that if you are selected as an AFP Chicago Fellow, you or your organization will be required to provide a \$100 non-refundable annual enrollment fee. You/your organization will also agree to pay your 2016 membership fee upon completion of the 2015 program.

Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee and applicants may be asked to participate in a phone interview prior to selection. Candidates chosen to be Fellows will be notified in writing by November 17, 2014, and introduced to the membership December 4, 2014. Fellows selected for the 2015 program will need to be available to attend the December 4 Annual Meeting/Holiday Event.

The Fellows Program will begin in January 2015. A detailed calendar will be provided and regular attendance is expected.
