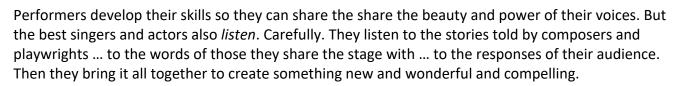


MICHELLE SHERBUN: An artist in a suit
