Aaron Rodgers serves as Hyde Park Art Center's Director of Development, joining the organization in 2014. Aaron co-chairs the Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access (IDEA) Committee for the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) Chicago chapter. He co-founded and co-leads the chapter's White Fundraisers Advocating for Racial Equity group.

Aaron has been involved in Chicago art and culture for 20 years and has programmed and presented more than 500 events. In 2008, Aaron founded Homeroom, an organization dedicated to presenting and commissioning arts programming around Chicago with a focus on conversation and collaboration across genre and media. In 2017, he joined the Board of Directors of Elastic Arts, a Logan Square venue dedicated to presenting jazz, hip-hop, visual art, dance, and other media, and co-chairs the Board's Development Committee. He received a BA from New York University's Gallatin School of Individualized Study in 2002 where he concentrated on philosophy and aesthetics.
